The HUB Playground Wali Jones Mural

Partnership with We Embrace Fatherhood, Philadelphia Contemporary, and Mural Arts

1. Introduction

We Embrace Fatherhood, Philadelphia Contemporary, and Mural Arts Philadelphia are collaborating on the installation of an exterior mural at the 37th & Mt Vernon Park Playground, better known in the community as the HUB Playground, located in the heart of the Mantua neighborhood in West Philadelphia.

The mural will be a tribute to Wali Jones, a West Philadelphia native and former 76ers starting guard. He won a championship ring alongside Wilt Chamberlain on the vaunted 1967 Philadelphia 76ers team, which was voted into the Hall of Fame as the best team in the NBA's first 25 years. Wali remains active on the court and in his community as the founder of Shoot For The Stars Institute, a youth workforce program aimed at providing human development and positive peer leadership training through an athletic approach.

Project

We seek one lead artist to create and execute a mural design for a building wall that faces the HUB Playground basketball court at 3722 Mt. Vernon Street, Philadelphia, PA 19104. An assistant artist selected by the artists and the MAP team will support the lead artist in painting the mural.

The goals for creating the mural, and for the process that leads up to it, are to

- Provide a prominent visual feature at the HUB Playground to celebrate and acknowledge the accomplishments of Wali Jones a native West Philadelphia community leader and athlete.
- Use public art to bring greater visibility to We Embrace Fatherhood's longstand commitment and impact in the community as part of a fundraising strategy for capacity building.

The lead artists will be paid \$10,000, which covers all artist fees, including design and mural production and installation.

Artists who are based in West Philadelphia, with a familiarity with the Mantua neighborhood, and work in visual, two-dimensional mediums with a focus on portraiture are encouraged to apply.

2. Background

About the HUB Playground

The 37th and Mt. Vernon Playground, known as the HUB Playground due to the longstanding efforts of programming provided by the HUB Coalition, includes a full basketball court and two-aged specific play areas. The vibrant community green space has served as a safe space to play, exercise and connect with neighbors. The multifunctional space serves as a refuge for the community to provide mutual aid, including functioning as a meal distribution site and a resource center giving out school supplies and books.

About We Embrace Fatherhood

The HUB Playground is a central location where We Embrace Fatherhood (WEF) offers a range of open and free holistic wellness programs, including basketball clinics, fit camps, mental health support circles, and pop-up food distributions. WEF is a non-profit family services organization founded by a coalition of West Philadelphia fathers, activists and artists committed to providing experiences and fostering relationships that allow youth, families and staff to redefine and reach their highest potential. WEF leaders, as a collective, have successfully provided services to residents in the city of Philadelphia for over two decades. Programs include public art exhibits, community events, youth-development programs and ongoing dialogue about fostering strong male engagement.

3. Scope of Work, Budget and Schedule

Scope of Work

The mural project at 3722 Mt. Vernon Street will involve painting a mural on the wall of a privately-owned building that faces the basketball court. The size of the wall is approximately 73' wide by 25' ft at the tallest corner on the right and 22.5' at the shortest corner on the left side of the wall (1,665 sq ft).

The artist will be expected to create a design for the mural, which will need to be approved by community and project partner stakeholders. The design concept should include a prominent portrait of Wali Jones, placement of an inspiring quote from Joe Walker, a prominent Mantua community leader and founder of the HUB Coalition, and a simple background that complements the portrait of Wali. The artist will be provided with the approved photograph of Wali to use as reference for the mural design and other contextual information about his legacy and the Mantu community. An assistant artist selected by the lead artist and MAP will support the production and installation of the mural.

Artist Scope

The artist will be expected to provide the following services.

- Conduct research as necessary to understand the site and the project, and other considerations as necessary to inform the artistic approach
- Create a design for the mural and prepare the digital files that are necessary for design review and projection.
- Present concept to Mural Arts and to a stakeholder committee that includes project partners and community leaders.
- Collaborate with Mural Arts production team on the completion of mural
- Participate in two community and stakeholder engagement activities:
 - Meet the Artist community outdoor event at the HUB Playground
 - Mural dedication event at the HUB Playground
- Fulfill artist responsibilities within contracted budget and schedule

Mural Arts Scope

Mural Arts will provide the following support to the selected artist:

- Assist with reviews and permissions
- Provide production support, including the provision of technical assistance, materials, supplies, equipment and labor as required
- Coordinate community engagement logistics
- Coordinate marketing and documentation

Philadelphia Contemporary (PC) and We Embrace Fatherhood (WEF) Scope

PC and WEF will collaborate to provide the following support to the select artist:

 Organize logistics of community engagement events and access to community and stakeholder participants

Artist Fee and Budget

The lead artist will be paid \$10,000, which covers the artist fee. The fee includes artist research, concept design, mural production and installation of the mural, and participation in the two public events as described in the scope. The assistant artist will be paid \$5,000 to support the lead artist with the installation of the mural.

4. Artist Selection Process

Eligibility

Lead artist who lives or works in the West Philadelphia area, with a familiarity of the Mantua community is preferred. An artist with experience with a visual medium, especially in portrait painting, is highly preferred.

Selection Process

The artist will be selected based on their response to the RFQ by a committee comprised of We Embrace Fatherhood, Philadelphia Contemporary, Wali Jones, Mantua community leaders and Mural Arts staff.

Qualifications and Review Criteria

Artists will be selected based on their body of past work, expressed interest and approach to the project and willingness to collaborate with stakeholders and community members.

Submission Requirements

Interested artists should submit:

- The attached application checklist, including artist contact information and an inventory of all material that is being submitted.
- A CV or resume (up to 2 pages)
- Current artist statement
- Application Narrative: A one-page response that addresses your artistic practice, relevant past experience with community-engaged projects and interest in this specific project. The narrative should include responses to:
 - What motivates you / interests you most about the project?
 - What experience have you had that connects you with the theme of this project or community?
 - Your general availability to complete the project, indicating other professional obligations and any other constraints that might impact your availability.
- Work Samples: Up to 10 work samples. Images must be:
 - Digital images must be JPEG files and must be no more than 300dpi and no larger than 1024 x 768-pixel resolution. Each image must be unlocked and downloadable for viewing.
 - Each JPEG file must be titled with the artist's name and number that corresponds to the annotated image list. File name example: JonesJane001, JonesJane002.
- Work Sample List: Please provide a list of the work samples you are submitting, including the following information:
 - Project name, Artist's name, Title of artwork, Location, Date of Completion, Budget, Medium,

• References: Please provide contact information for two people who can speak to your ability to do work like this. Please provide the person's name, address, email address and telephone (preferably other public art partners)
